Approval is the result of 5 ½ years of research.

Naysayers doubted success, felt nothing significant about the building.

Property qualified due to its architectural significance.

The Queen Anne style is rare in Oregon churches (less than 4% listed in the state database).


Found to be the most elaborate Queen Anne in the state.

The method used for the 1917 addition – bisecting, separating & infilling – was common in New England but unique in Oregon.

Listing a relocated building is a challenge. However, keeping it in the same neighborhood, on the same street with the same orientation retained its locational integrity.







Window Restoration

Repairing & restoring the original wooden windows.

12 of the 21 windows have been completed to-date.

A window sponsorship campaign is currently underway.











Interior Demolition

Removing interior partitions & false ceilings.

Removing lath & plaster on exterior walls to expose existing conditions.


350 volunteer hours expended to-date.





Structural Reinforcement

Adding framing for lateral reinforcement of north & south exterior end walls. Adding sheathing to both sides of pocket door opening for lateral stability. Work performed by licensed contractor with building permit.



Continue developing community connections by partnering with other area nonprofits and hosting events for children and families.




