

Ordinance No 84

187

An Ordinance dividing the City of Albany into three wards, and to provide for the election of two Aldermen from each ward,

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany.

Section 1. That for the purpose of Municipal representation the City of Albany be and is hereby divided into three wards designated and bounded as follows. Ward number one is hereby declared to include all of that part of such City as lies west of the middle of Ferry Street to fourth street along the middle of fourth street to a point opposite the corner of the Court House, thence south to the corner of Fifth Street, thence west to the corner of Ferry Street thence south along the center of Ferry Street to the southern boundary of the City. Ward number two is hereby declared to include all that part of such from the eastern boundary of ward number one to the middle of Baker Street; and ward number three is hereby declared to include all of such City as shall lie east of ward number two.

Section 2. There shall be elected on the first Monday in December 1898 by the legally qualified electors residing within said wards two

Aldermen from each ward and the one receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected for two years, and on the first Monday of December in the Year 1879 and every Year thereafter there shall be elected one Alderman from each ward to serve for two years

Section 3, All ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed
