

## Ordinance No. 116.

Amdending a clause in the ordinance making a tax on dogs and regulating their running at large.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany,

Sec(1) That a clause of our ordinance making a tax on dogs and regulating their running at large be amended so as to read as follows to wit: Every person owning or keeping within the city of Albany any dog or dogs shall pay a yearly tax of one dollar on each dog - and on the said tax to be paid to the City Recorder on or before the first day of August of each year, and it shall be the duty of the recorder to give the person so paying a receipt; provided that in case such tax shall not be paid on or before the first day of August of each year, that after that date it shall be one dollar and a half on each dog so owned or kept as aforesaid, and the same shall be collected by the Marshal who shall be allowed to retain out of every dollar and a half so collected the sum of fifty cents as compensation for his services for such collection; provided further that each pup or bitch owned or kept in the city limits shall be taxed the same as a dog and if not by August 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, that the Marshal shall collect the sum of \$3.00 and be allowed to retain 15<sup>¢</sup> for his services.

Sec(2) This ordinance to take effect and be in force from and five days after its publication.
