

Ordinance No 178.

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An Ordinance to provide for the time and manner of constructing a Sewer in Railroad Street commencing at a point $67\frac{3}{10}$ feet south, $168\frac{5}{10}$ W. of the south west corner of a brick warehouse belonging to the estate of C. L. Cowan deceased and running thence 20° east 150 feet to a point 16 feet from the center of Railroad Street, and extending along Railroad Street to the north line of Eighth Street.

The People of the City of Albany do enact as follows:

Section 1. The proposed sewer in Railroad Street, commencing at a point $67\frac{3}{10}$ feet south $168\frac{5}{10}$ W. of the south west corner of a brick warehouse belonging to the estate of C. L. Cowan deceased, and running thence 20° east $150\frac{\text{feet}}$ to a point 16 feet from the center of Railroad Street, and extending along Railroad Street to the north line of Eighth Street, shall be completed as hereinafter provided; within ninety days after the signing of the contract therefor by the parties thereto, as far south as the north line of Fourth Street during the present year 1888.

Section 2. A sewer shall be constructed in Railroad Street commencing at a point $67\frac{3}{10}$ ^{feet} south $168\frac{5}{10}$ west of the south west corner of a brick warehouse belonging to the estate of C. L. Cowan, deceased, and running thence 20° east 150 feet to a point 16 feet from the center of Railroad Street, and extending along Railroad Street to the north line of Fourth Street, and that portion of the street necessary

to be used for digging the trenches shall be cleared of all obstacles at the expense of the contractor, who shall, after the pipe is laid and the trench filled, leave said street in as good order and repair as the same was before said trench was dug, and shall remove at his own expense all dirt gravel and rubbish that may remain after such trench is filled, except such portion thereof as the Committee on Streets and Public Property may direct to be left on the ground for the purpose of making other improvements.

Section 3. The sewer improvement herein provided for shall consist of putting in a sewer of Terra Cotta or cement pipe of thirty (30) inches of inside diameter, with catch basins, man-holes, lamp-holes, sockets and branches at such points as the Committee on Streets and Public Property and the Street Commissioner may designate; the work to be done and the materials furnished to be strictly in accordance with plans and specifications for a sewer in Railroad Street commencing at a point $67\frac{3}{10}$ ^{feet} South $168\frac{5}{10}$ W. of the south west corner of a brick ware house belonging to the Estate of C. L. Cowan deceased, and running thence 20° east 150 feet to a point 16 feet from the center of Railroad Street, and extending along Railroad Street to the north line of Eighth street, to be prepared by the City Surveyor and filed in the office of the City Recorder, before bids for (commencing) constructing said sewer are invited.

Section 4. The Contractor shall take and

have entire charge of the work during its progress, and shall be responsible for any loss or accident resulting from carelessness or neglect.

Section 5. The improvement shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Common Council of the City of Albany.

Section 6. The Contract shall contain a provision that for each day required to complete said Contract, after the expiration of the time fixed for its completion, the Contractor or Contractors shall forfeit to the City of Albany the sum of ten dollars; and the Contractor or Contractors, shall make, execute and deliver to the City of Albany such bond and with such sureties as the City may require, or as may be determined by the Contract.

Section 7. After the plans and specifications for said proposed sewer in Railroad Street shall have been filed with the Recorder of the City, the said Recorder is hereby empowered to advertise and receive bids for the construction of said sewer and report the same to the Council for acceptance or rejection, and after the bid has been accepted by the Council, the Committee on Streets and Public Property are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to enter into a written contract with the person, firm or corporation to whom the Common Council may award the contract for the construction of said sewer in accordance with the said plans and specifications and subject to the terms, conditions and restrictions herein contained.
