

Ordinance No. 278.

An Ordinance to amend Section (10) ten of Ordinance number 159, entitled, "An Ordinance creating, and regulating the Fire Department of the City of Albany", Passed the Council August 16, 1887, Approved August 23rd 1887.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section: That section (10) ten of Ordinance number 159, entitled, "An Ordinance creating, and regulating the Fire Department of the City of Albany", passed by the Council August 16-1887, and approved by the Mayor, August 23rd 1887, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 10: Each Steam Engine Company shall be allowed for ordinary expenses of the company the sum of (\$10.00) fifteen dollars per quarter; each Hook, and Ladder Company shall be allowed the sum of \$5.00 five dollars per quarter; and the Board of Delegates of the Fire Department shall be allowed the sum of (\$5.00) five dollars per quarter.

Section 2: All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, in so far as they are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from, and after the first day of February, 1894.
