

Ordinance No. 280.

An Ordinance Authorizing, and Directing the Committee on Streets, and Public Property of the City of Albany, Oregon, to have the "High Steel Bridge," across the Willamette river, at Calapooia street redecked, to purchase the materials required, and hire the work done.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Committee on Streets, and Public Property of the City of Albany, Oregon, are hereby authorized, and directed to purchase, at the lowest market price, and on the best terms possible, not to exceed 125,000 feet, (or so much thereof as may be required to redeck the "High Steel Bridge," across the Willamette river,) of the best quality of red fir lumber, to be of even thickness, and three (3) inches thick, twelve(2) inches wide, and sixteen(16) eighteen feet in length; the plank required to make the tans on the approaches, to be rived diagonally. And said Committee are hereby further authorized, and directed to purchase such other material, that may be required for such work, at the lowest market price, and to employ a sufficient number of hands to do the work.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force from, and after its approval by the Mayor.
