Ordinance - No. 285.

An Ordinance to Prohibit the riding of Bicycles, Tricycles, or Velocipedes on the sidewalks on Certain streets in the City of Albany, and to regulate the riding of the same on the sidewalks, and over the Steel Wagon Bridge across the Willamette river in said City.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person to ride a Bicycle, Tricycle, or velocipede on the sidewalk on First, or Second streets, between Washington, and Baker streets, or on Fern, Broadalbin, Ellsworth, or Lyon streets, between First and Second street, or on the East side of Lyon street from Second street, to Ninth street, in the City of Albany, Oregon: provided that cripples using any of such vehicles for purposes of travel, shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

Section 2: That it shall be unlawful for any person to ride a Bicycle, Tricycle, or velocipede over the street wagon Bridge across the Willamette river in said City at a greater rate of speed than four (4) miles an hour, or on any sidewalk in said City during the night time at a greater rate of speed than six (6) miles an hour, or to ride a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede at any time, on any sidewalk in said City carelessly, or negligently, or at such a rate of speed, or in such a manner, as to interfere with the free use of said sidewalk by pedestrians.

Section 3: That it shall be unlawful for any person to ride a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede in said City during the night time, without a head, or signal light displayed, or placed in a conspicuous manner, and in plain view on such bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

Section 4: That any person violating any of the provisions

of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court of said city, be fined not less than five dollars, no more than thirty dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail not less than two days, nor more than fifteen days.

Section 5: That all of section 41- of ordinance no-152, entitled, "An ordinance concerning offenses, and disorderly conduct, defining what shall constitute the same, and providing for the punishment thereof," passed the Council May 10<sup>th</sup> 1887, and approved by the Mayor May 12<sup>th</sup> 1887, and all ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from, and after its approval by the Mayor.

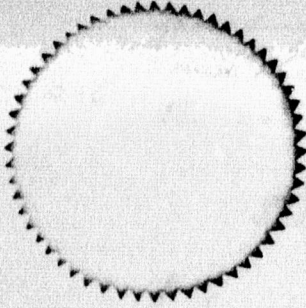
