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ORDINANCE NO. 490.

Contract for Paving Broadalbin Street  
between Second and Third Streets.

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder  
of the City of Albany, Oregon, to enter into a con-  
tract with the Warren Construction Company  
for the improvement of Broadalbin Street  
from the North Curb line of Third Street to the  
South line of Second Street in said City of  
Albany.

The people of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:-

Whereas, by Ordinance No. 486 of the City of  
Albany, Oregon, passed by the Council on  
the 28<sup>th</sup> day of June 1909, and approved by the  
Mayor on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1909, it was  
ordered that the following street of said  
City of Albany, to wit:-

Broadalbin Street from the North Curb  
line of Third Street to the South line of Second  
in said City of Albany, be improved as follows:-  
First, By grading said street to the proper sub-grade.  
Second, By paving the roadway of said street full  
width with Bituminous Pavement.  
Third, By laying and constructing Bituminous Headers.  
Fourth, By Constructing inlets.  
Fifth, By laying vitrified sewer pipe.

Said improvement to be made in accord-  
ance with the Charter and Ordinance of the  
City of Albany, Oregon, the plans, specifica-  
tions and estimates of the City Engineers, filed  
in the Office of the City Recorder of said City.  
And Whereas, it was provided in said Ordin-  
ance that the Recorder of said City give  
notice for bids for the making of said im-  
provement in the manner provided by  
law and by said ordinance.

And Whereas, after due notice and adver-  
tisement for bids, made and given by the  
City Recorder of said City according to  
law and the ordinance last aforesaid, to wit,  
on the 13<sup>th</sup> of July, 1909, the Warren Con-  
struction Company, a corporation of Port  
land, Oregon, presented to the Council its  
bid for making said proposed improve-

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ment, which bid was made in due form  
in conformity with all the conditions  
imposed by law laid by the Council, by which  
said bid said Warren Construction Company  
proposed to furnish all material and ele-  
ments to perform the labor necessary to  
make the above described improvement  
for the following named prices:

Excavation, per cubic yard - - - -	\$0.75
Curbstone, per cubic yard - - - -	\$0.20
Petalithic surface including the Bituminous crushed rock founda- tion & surface finishing coarse,	
per square yard - - - -	\$2.25

Inlets, Price per each - - - - \$12.50

Drain Pipe, 6inch, Price per lineal foot, \$0.70

Petalithic Headers, Price per lineal foot \$0.40

And Whereas, Said Warren Construction Com-  
pany was the lowest responsible bidder  
for said proposed work and said bid  
was the lowest and best bid therefore,  
of Section 1. That the said bid of the  
Warren Construction Company for said im-  
provement of said above described street  
be as the same is hereby accepted. And the  
Mayor and the Recorder of said City are here-  
by authorized to enter into a Contract,  
in writing, with the said Warren Construc-  
tion Company for the making of said  
improvement as aforesaid, on behalf of the  
City upon the terms mentioned in said bid  
and Contract to provide further, that the  
work of said proposed improvement  
shall commence within thirty days after  
the signing of said Contract and to be  
carried with such vigor that all the work  
embraced in said Contract shall be entirely  
completed on or before the first day of Octo-  
ber 1909, and that the City of Albany shall  
be deemed to suffer damages to the extent  
of ten dollars per day for each calendar  
day the work is delayed beyond

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said specified time; <sup>in</sup> that the said Warren Construction Company furnish a bond in the sum of \$1000<sup>00</sup> to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, having as surety some surety company authorized to do business in the State of Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract on the part of the Warren Construction Company, further indemnifying the City of Albany against any claim or liens for labor, work or materials on the part of any person arising out of said contract.

Section 2. Whereas the public health and safety requires that work be commenced on said proposed improvement at an early date <sup>as</sup> before the winter rains render it impossible to properly perform the same, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force <sup>and</sup> effect from <sup>as</sup> after its approval by the Mayor.
