

ORDINANCE NO. 546

Entering into a Contract for paving Third Street.

The Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, to enter into a contract with the Warren Construction Company, for the improvement of Third Street from the East curb line of Calagovia Street to the West curb line of Baker Street. Excepting therefrom the intersections of Washington, Terry, Broadalbin, Ellsworth and Lyon streets with said Third Street.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:
Whereas: By Ordinance No. 537 of the City of Albany Oregon, passed by the Council on the 12th day of April, 1911 and approved by the Mayor on the 13th day of April, 1911, it was ordered that the following Street of the said City of Albany, to wit:—

Third Street from the East curb line of Calagovia Street, to the West curb line of Baker Street. Excepting therefrom the intersections of Washington, Terry, Broadalbin, Ellsworth and Lyon Streets, with said Third Street, be improved in the following manner, to wit:—

- First: In grading said street to the proper sub grade.
- Second: In paving the roadway of said street full width with Bituminous concrete.
- Third: By laying and constructing Bituminous Road.
- Fourth: By constructing curbs.
- Fifth: By constructing Catch Basins.
- Sixth: By laying vitrified Sewer Pipe.

Said improvements to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Albany, Oregon, and the plans and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer then on file with the City Recorder of said City of Albany.

And Whereas: It was provided in said Ordinance that the Recorder of said City, give notice for bids for the making of said improvement in the manner provided by law and by said Ordinance.

And Whereas: after due notice and advertisement for bids made and given by the City Recorder of said City, according to law, and the remained last aforesaid, to wit:— On the 28th day of May, 1911 the Warren Construction Company, a Corporation, of Portland, Oregon, presented to the Council of said City, its bid for making said proposed improvement, which bid was made in due form and in conformity with all the conditions imposed by law, and by the Council, by which said bid said Warren Construction Company,

Entering into a contract for paving Third Street.

Proposed to furnish all material and implements, and perform the labor necessary to make the above described improvements, for the following named prices:

Excavation per cubic yard.	\$0.75
Fill, per cubic yard.	\$0.25
Bitulithic Pavement, including the surfacing, finishing course and bituminous foundation, per square yard.	\$2.50
Bitulithic Headers, per linear foot	\$1.40
Catch Basins, each.	\$2.00
Inlets, each.	\$1.25
Drainage vitrified sewer pipe, per linear foot	\$0.10

And Whereas: Said Warren Construction Company, on said 10th day of May, 1911, agreed in open Council to maintain in repair in good, serviceable condition the Bitulithic Pavement laid by it on said street for a period of five (5) years, Also, that said Sewer Pipe would be laid at a cost of 50 cents per linear foot, and

Whereas: Said Warren Construction Company, was the lowest responsible bidder for said proposed work, and said bid was the lowest and best bid therefor.

Section 1: That the said bid of the Warren Construction Company for said improvement of said described street, be and its value is hereby accepted, and the Mayor and Recorder of said City are hereby authorized to enter into a contract in writing with the said Warren Construction Company, for the making of said improvement as aforesaid, on behalf of the City of Albany upon the terms mentioned in said bid, and the agreement hereinafter mentioned.

Said contract to provide further, that the work of said improvement, shall commence within thirty days after the signing of said contract, and to be prosecuted with such vigor, that all the work embraced in said contract shall be entirely completed on or before the first day of October, 1911, and the City of Albany shall be deemed to suffer damages, to the extent of ten (\$10) per dollar per day for each and every day the work is delayed beyond said specified time, and that the Warren Construction Company, furnish a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars, to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon, having as surety some surety company authorized to do business in the State of Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract on the part of the Warren Construction Company, and further indemnifying the City of Albany against any claims or suits for labor, work or materials on the part of any person claiming any part of such contract.

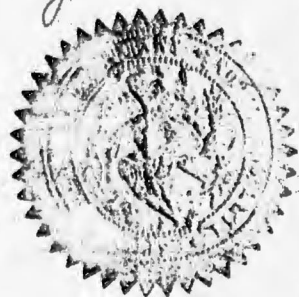
