

ORDINANCE NO. 90

ord 695

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany to enter into a contract for the building and construction of a water tower and tank at the Three-in-the-Breast addition to Glens Falls, connected with Park St. to connect to main sewer line, to be according to the plans, profiles and specifications and in the office of the recorder of the City of Albany, on the 10th day of October, 1899.

Whereas it is desired to put in and block Three-in-the-Breast addition to the City of Albany, therefore I will give notice to construct a water tower and tank; and

Whereas it has been provided by ordinance of the Recorder of the City of Albany give notice for making of said improvement in the manner and by law and said ordinance, and

Whereas after due time and advertisement given to the public and giving to the Recorder of the City of Albany according to said ordinance on the 8th day of October, 1899, that W. S. Hearey presented to the council of making his bid for making said improvement, which bid was made in due form and in conformity with all the conditions imposed by law at the said ordinance, in which bid which W. S. Hearey proposed to furnish and make said improvement and performing into accordance to make the said described improvement for the sum of \$27,750, and

Whereas said W. S. Hearey was the lowest bidder, and proposed work and said bid was the lowest and best bid for

## Therefore:

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the said bid of W. S. Hearey for said improvement is and is hereby accepted and the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany are hereby authorized to enter into a contract in writing with said W. S. Hearey for making said improvement as specified herein, by the City Council, so soon as up to time and conditions in said ordinance advertisement may bid will be mentioned. Said contract shall provide that the work shall be done and commence within ten days after the signing of said contract and to prosecute with all vigor throughout the work and until it is completed shall be entirely completed and for the safety of persons, and the City of Albany, therefore shall be bound to suffer damages to the

cent of \$10.00 per day for each and every day the work is delayed beyond the specified time.

This contract shall provide that the said three days of overtime, unless otherwise payment to all persons performing labor and supplies, for the prosecution of the services or the cost of work and labor via M.C.U. will not exceed any sum or claim for cost or hours worked against the City of Albany for or on account of any material or labor required for the said work.

This contract shall also contain a condition that no person shall be employed for more than eight hours in any one day or sixteen hours in any two days in case of emergency when no other competent labor is available and that in such cases such labor shall be paid double wages for extra time.

This contract shall also contain a condition that the contract may be cancelled at the election of the City of Albany or any sufficient desire expressed by the said S. Wearden to fail to fully perform the contract according to its terms.

The said S. Wearden shall furnish a special bond in the sum of \$200.00 which will be sufficient guarantee to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, to secure the faithful performance of all the obligations of the contractor to the City of Albany and particularly against any claim or lien for labor, work or materials on the part of any person arising out of this contract.
