

An Ordinance to regulate hitching of animals; to provide for private hitching places; to provide a penalty for the violation of this ordinance; and to repeal Section 15 of Ordinance No. 152 entitled "An ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct, defining what shall constitute the same and providing for the punishment thereof," passed by the Council May 3rd, 1887, and approved by the Mayor June 13, as amended by Ordinance No. 788 entitled "An ordinance to amend Section 15 of Ordinance No. 152, entitled 'an ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct,' defining what shall constitute the same and providing for the punishment thereof," passed by the Council May 3rd, 1887, and approved by the Mayor May 13, 1888," passed by the Council April 14th, 1915.

The People of the City of Albany Do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. Any person who shall hitch or fasten any horse, mare, or mule, or any animal to any fixed object located upon any alley in the City of Albany shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court shall be fined not exceeding twenty dollars or imprisoned in the City Jail not more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 2. Any person who shall hitch or fasten any horse, mare, or mule, or any animal to any shade tree, or to the curb or box around any shade tree in any street, avenue or public place in the City of Albany shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court shall be fined not exceeding twenty dollars or imprisonment in the City Jail not more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 3. That within the limits of the territory bounded by a line commencing where the center line of Washington Street intersects the center line of Water Street and running thence north to the center line of Water Street and thence running thence west to the center line of Fifth Street; thence westerly along the center line of Fifth Street to an intersection with the center line of Baker Street; thence westerly along the center line of Baker Street to an intersection with the center line of Water Street; and thence westerly along the center line of Water Street to the place of beginning, and houses, fences or occupants of any property may secure signals, having attached thereto a counterpane or ring not exceeding twelve inches in diameter, inside measurement, to be placed along the curb adjacent to the property owned, leased or occupied by the owner, lessee or occupant of the same.

An ordinance concerning offenses and disorders, conduct, defining what shall constitute the same and providing for the punishment thereof passed by the Council May 3rd, 1887, and approved by the Mayor May 13, 1887, passed by the Council April 14th, 1915, is and the same is hereby repealed.
