## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE LAYOR AND RECORDER OF THE CITY OF ALBANY, OREGON, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH FRANCIS M. TRAVIS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE APPROACH TO THE STEEL BRIDGE AT THE NORTH END OF CALAPOCIA STREET, AND THE INTERBECTION OF FIRST AND CALAPOCIA STREETS IN SAID CITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Albany deems it expedient to improve the approach to the steel bridge at the North end of Calapooia Street and the intersection of First and Calapooia Streets adjacent thereto with Asphaltic Concrete Pavement, and

WHEREAS, Francis M. Travis is now making improvements on portions of Washington and First Streets in said City and has submitted her bid for the making of said improvement of said approach to said bridge and intersection of said streets with Asphaltic Concrete Pavement on an Asphaltic Concrete base in accordance with the plans and specifications of the City Engineer of said City filed in the office of the Recorder of said City on the 26th day of July, 1916, and by which said bid the said Francis M. Travis agrees to make said improvement for the sum of \$1.60 per square yard.

## THEREFORE

THE PROPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. That the bid of the said Francis M. Travis be and
the same is hereby accepted and the Mayor and Recorder of the City
of Albany, Oregon, are hereby authorized to enter into a contract
with said Francis M. Travis for the making of said improvement
with Asphaltic Concrete Pavement on behalf of the City of Albany,
Oregon, upon the terms mentioned in said bid.

Said contract to provide further that the work of said improvement shall commence within ten days after the signing of said contract and shall be prosecuted with such vigor that all the work embraced therein shall be entirely completed on or before the 1st day of September, 1916, unless further time be extended by the Council of said City, and the City of Albany shall be deemed to suffer damages to the extend of \$5.00 per day for each and every day the said work is delayed beyond said specified time, and that the said Francis M. Travis furnish a bond in the sum of \$500.00 to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract, and

further imdemnifying said City of Albany against any claim or lien for labor, work or material on the part of any person, firm or corporation, arising out of said contract.

Section 2. Whereas it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Albany that this ordinance shall become immediately operative, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
