ORDINANCE NO. 976.

AN ORDINANCE to Amend Section No.2 of ORDINANCE No.468 of the City of Albany, Oregon, "Entitled an Ordinance relating to the construction of sidewalks and curbing, within certain limits of the City of Albany and repealing all ORDINANCES and parts of ORDINANCES in conflict there with passed by the Council, November 10th, 1908 and approved by the Mayor November 11th , 1908 amended by Section No.1 of Ordinance No.619 of the City of Albany, Oregon, "Entitled an Ordinance to amend section No.2 and Section No. 4 of Ordinance No. 468 of the City of Albany, Oregon entitled an Ordinance relating to the construction of sidewalks and curting within certain limits in the City of Albany and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith, " passed by the Council on the 23rd day of October 1912 and approved by the Mayor on the 23rd day of October 1912.

THEREFORE

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO OFDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 468 as amended by Ordinance No. 619 be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 2 the provision of this ordinance shall apply to the district bounded and described as follows:
