ORDINANCE NO. 1858

AN ORDINANCE providing for the holding of a special election on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November, 1926, in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City, for their adoption or rejection a certain charter amendment, as appears by Resolution No. 39 1926, of said City, adopted on the 22nd day of September, 1926, designating the places for holding such election, appointing the officers therefor and providing the manner and places for holding the same and declaring an emergency.

THE PROPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

. Section 1. That in the manner provided by law, and as hereinafter provided a special election shall be held in the City of Albany, Oregon, on Tuesday, November 2, 1926, commencing at the hour of eight oclock A.M. and continuing until the hour of eight o'clock P.H. of said day.

Section 2. Except as herein otherwise provided said special election shall be conducted in the same manner as general elections in said City are conducted. The following places are hereby designated as the places for holding such special election:

First ward: County Recorder's Office, Court House.

Second ward: County Sheriff's office Court House.

Third ward: Madison Street school building.

Section 3. The following persons are hereby designated and appointed as judges and clerks of said special election in the respective wards, as follows:

First ward: Judges--A.G.Senders, Clerks--Cora E. Hopkins,

Lola Junkin,

Ella Swan.

Kate Stewart. Second ward: Judges -- Leila Mitchell,

Clerks -- Loretta J. Davis, Lucy Preston.

Clara B. Swank, Mattie Burggraf.

Clerks -- Dora A. Bowers, G.H.Knox.

Third ward: Judgest-W.A.Cox, MaryA. Harris,

Riverta Williamson.

Section 4. That previous to entering upon the discharge of their efficial duties said judges and clerks shall each take and subscribe to an oath in the followform, to-wit;

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support the constituion and laws of the United States and of the state of Orggon; that I will perform the duties of judge (or clerk as the case may be) of election according to law and to the best of my shility, and I will studiously endeavor to prevent fraud, deceit and abuse in conducting said election,"

said oath to be administered to the judges and clerks by an official authorized to administer oaths, and in the absence of any such official, then one of the persons chosen to act as judge is hereby empowered to administer the oath to the judges and clerks of the election, and the person administering the oath shall cause an entry thereof to be made and subscribed by him and prefixed in the poll books.

Section 5. That if any judge of said election, as above named, shall fail to then the judges may appoint another in his place.

Section 6. The City Recorder shall give notice of said special election by publication thereof in the Albany Democrat-Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Albany, once a week for two consecutive and successive weeks within thirty days next preceding said special election, such notice shall state the measure to be voted upon thereat, and the places designated for the holding of such election and the time thereof.

Section 8. The Recorder shall cause to be printed in pamphlet form a true copy section 8. The Recorder shall cause to be printed in pampings form a true copy of the ballot title and text of each proposed amendment and messure submitted, with the number and form in which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot, as provided in and by said Resolution No. 39, and shall mail a copy thereof to each voter in the City of Albany, Oregon, whose address he may have, not later than five days before the date of said election, upon which date said proposed amendment is to be voted upon. Preceding the copy of such Act shall be a statement that the same will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Albany at a special election to be held in said City on Tuesday, November 2, 1926.

Section 9. The City Recorder shall cause to be printed and shall supply a sufficient number of ballots, copies of poll books, ink, pencils, stationery, and other necessary and proper supplies for said election, and the marshal shall install necessary voting booths and deliver ballot boxes and other supplies to the said jsudges and clerks of election at said voting places, in due time for their use by the voters judges, clerks and others interested in said special election, at the time of holding the same.
