

**ORDINANCE No. 1257**

AN ORDINANCE to regulate the use of vehicle traffic upon Second Street in the City of Albany, Oregon; providing a penalty for violation hereof, and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to park a vehicle of any description upon and along the north curb line of Second Street, between Broadalbin and Ferry Streets in the City of Albany, Oregon, except the East 90 feet thereof.

Section 2. Any person violating Section 1 of this Ordinance upon conviction thereof in the Recorder's Court shall be required to pay a fine of not more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned in the City Jail for a period of not more than 12 days, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 3. Whereas, the peace, health and safety of the <sup>people of the</sup> City of Albany require that this ordinance shall become immediately effective, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be and become ~~immediately effective~~ ~~therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist~~ ~~and this ordinance shall become immediately effective~~ in full force and effect immediately upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
