

ORDINANCE NO. 1501

AN ORDINANCE relating to cordwood.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All cordwood, if chopped, shall be four feet long from the extreme joint of one end to the commencement of the slope at the opposite end, and if sawed to be four feet long from end to end.

Section 2. A cord of wood shall be four feet wide, four feet high, and eight feet long, closely corded between stakes at each end without leadings, and shall contain 128 cubic feet.

Section 3. All persons selling wood within the city shall be required to deliver same corded up, as set forth in section 2 of this ordinance, and any person purchasing wood, not being satisfied with the length or manner in which the wood is corded, may make complaint to the city marshal, who shall immediately proceed to measure said wood in the presence of both parties.

Section 4. If said wood shall be full measure, the person so complaining shall pay to the marshal the sum of \$1, his fee for measuring the wood, but if such wood falls short of the regular measure, the seller shall pay the sum of \$1 to the marshal.
