

ORDINANCE NO. 1818

A BILL FOR:

AN ORDINANCE to amend Ordinance No. 1497 entitled "An Ordinance to regulate the storage and handling of petroleum and petroleum products and volatile oil products and providing a penalty for the violation thereof."

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That Section 2. thereof be amended by adding the following, eliminating the period and putting in a comma "excepting where the equipment used for pumping the gasoline or other volatile oil products has been approved by the Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. as being safe and proper for use within a building."

That Section 3. thereof be amended as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or association to install, maintain or continue a gasoline pump upon any sidewalk or between any sidewalk and curb or upon any of the streets within the City of Albany. That this prohibition shall be effective 90 days after the passage of this amendment to said ordinance.

That the remainder of the ordinance shall remain as written except for the amendments here made.
