

ORDINANCE NO. 2690

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF A DUPLICATOR MACHINE WITH DUEDALL-POTTS STATIONERS OF ALBANY, OREGON IN A SUM NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$255) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Council of the City of Albany do, by the passage of this ordinance, deem it impracticable to obtain bids for a duplicator machine.

Section 2: The Mayor and City Manager are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of a duplicator machine for a price not to exceed \$255.00 for the Finance Department with the Duedall-Potts Stationers Company of Albany, Oregon.

Section 3: The Council, by this ordinance, does hereby ratify any action heretofore taken as herein provided.

Section 4: Inasmuch as the passage of this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Albany, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon.
