

ORDINANCE NO. 2896

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND MANNER OF IMPROVING 13TH AVENUE FROM THE WEST LINE OF HILL STREET TO THE EXISTING PAVEMENT ON JACKSON STREET; PROVIDING HOW THE COST OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE PAID; DEEMING IT IMPRACTICAL TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH WARREN-NORTHWEST, INC. FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE SAME AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: 13th Avenue from the West line of Hill Street to the existing pavement on Jackson Street shall be improved in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file and referred to in Resolution No. 387 in the following manner: Asphaltic concrete paving, levelling course, and additional base.

Section 2: The improvements shall be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans and specifications and estimates for the said improvements filed in the office of the City Recorder on August 22, 1956.

Section 3: The cost of making said improvements shall be paid out of funds to be collected arising from assessments hereafter to be made, ascertained and declared by the Council of the City of Albany on the lots and parts of lots adjacent to the said portions of the street as especially and particularly benefitted thereby, and from the funds budgetted by the City of Albany for improvement of the same.

Section 4: The Council, at this time, deems it impractical to request and advertise for bids for the said improvement by reason of the necessity of immediate improvement and the lateness of the construction season, and therefore do hereby authorize the Mayor and City Manager to enter into a contract with Warren-Northwest, Inc., for construction of the said improvement on a negotiated unit price equal to the same or similar prices bid upon previous street work with the city during this construction period. Said construction shall be completed by October 31, 1956.

Section 5: Inasmuch as the provisions of this ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of Albany, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.
