

RESOLUTION NO. 4610

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REMOVAL OF A LOADING ZONE AND 65 FEET OF YELLOW CURB ON THE NORTH SIDE OF 4TH AVENUE EAST OF MADISON STREET.

WHEREAS, the property owner at 905 4th Avenue has requested removal of a loading zone and yellow curb along their 4th Avenue frontage; and


WHEREAS, the loading zone was originally created in order to serve a print shop and the print shop has since been closed; and

WHEREAS, the demand for on-street parking on 4th Avenue is high and removal of the loading zone will provide for additional on-street parking spaces.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council does hereby authorize the following change in parking restrictions:

1. Removal of the loading zone and 65 feet of yellow curb on the north side of 4th Avenue east of Madison Street.



SUBJECT: Removal of Loading Zone at 905 4th Avenue

Action Requested:

Staff recommends Council, by resolution, authorize removal of 65 feet of yellow curb on the north side of 4th Avenue east of Madison Street.

Discussion:

Robert Nelson, Superintendent of the Linn-Benton-Lincoln Education Service District (ESD), has requested that Albany eliminate the loading zone in front of 905 4th Avenue. The loading zone was created many years ago to accommodate delivery and pick up from the ESD's print shop. The print shop has since been closed down and the loading zone is no longer needed.

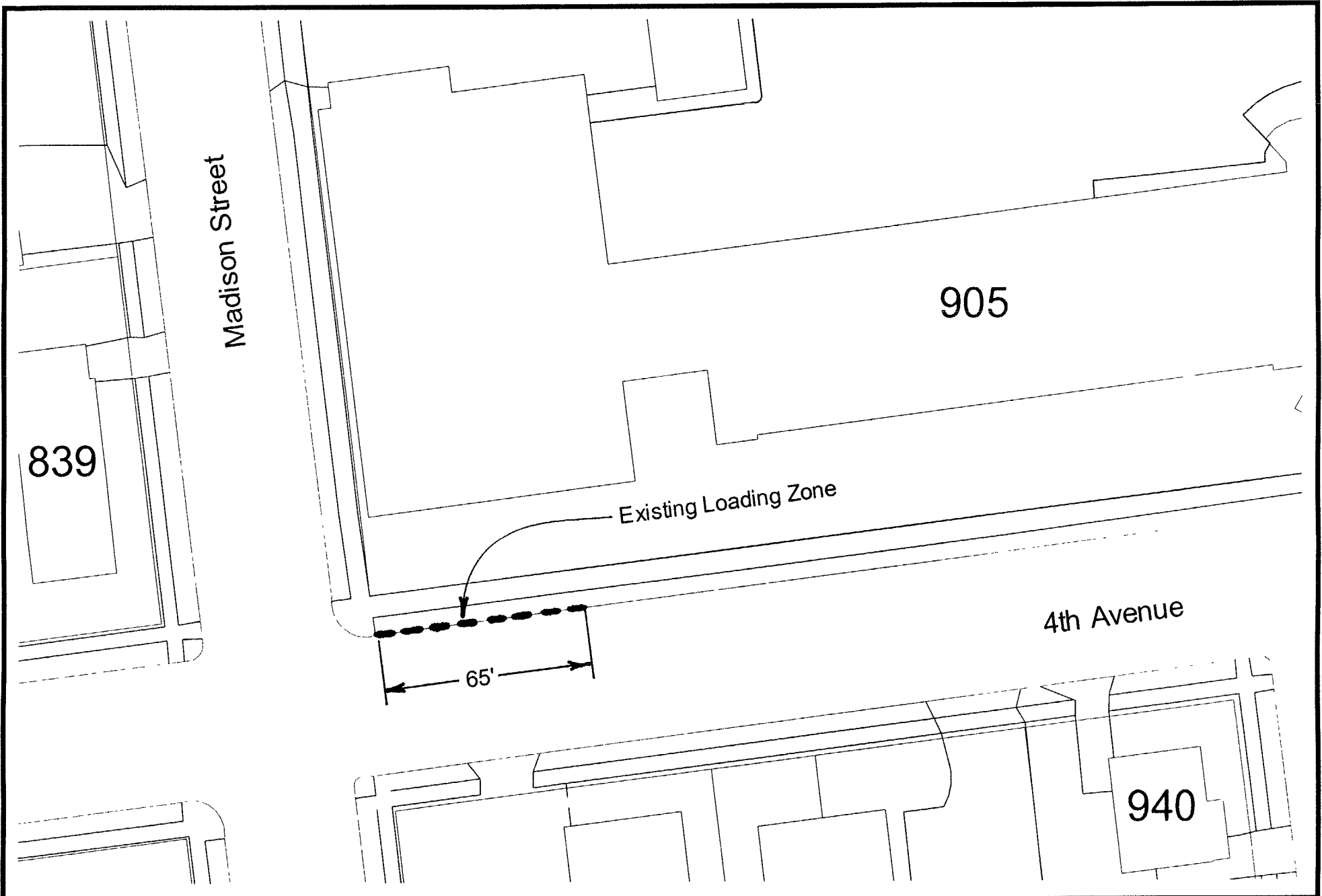
The yellow curb is located on the north side of 4th Avenue just east of Madison Street and is 65 feet in length. Elimination of the loading zone will provide room for three additional on-street parking spaces. The demand for on-street parking in the area is high, especially when the ESD holds training sessions. The removal of the loading zone will help to alleviate this problem.
